 affects the health and safety of workers.
- Promote the participation and consultation of our employees, through their representatives.
- Reduce the negative impact on the environment, prevent pollution, conduct actions aimed at the circular economy and the adaptation and mitigation of climate change.
- Develop training programmes for staff on environmental, quality, and occupational health and safety issues.
- Improve our competitiveness through innovation, increased productivity, and improved satisfaction and wellbeing of our employees and customers.
- To guarantee that our activity complies with the Good Environmental Practices agreement signed with the Las Palmas Port Authority (ASTICAN).
- Implement the corresponding controls in our processes to prevent money laundering, the financing of terrorism and the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction.
